| SB 17<br>5/5/11         | Legalizing the medical use of cannabis for patients with specific qualifying conditions  | Yes     |
| HB 39<br>6/2/15         | Decriminalization of cannabis possession or private use of a personal use quantity of cannabis (less than one ounce).  | Yes     |
| SB 90<br>6/11/15        | “Rylie’s Law” – adding intractable epilepsy to the list of debilitating conditions for which a physician may supply a written certification for medical cannabis   | Yes     |
| SB 181<br>6/16/16       | Allowing designated caregivers to possess and administer, and minor qualifying patients to use, medical cannabis oil on school busses and on school grounds  | Yes     |
| HB 332<br>6/7/16        | Adding misdemeanor possession of cannabis and paraphernalia offenses to the list of violations and offenses for which a person may be eligible for probation before judgment   | Yes     |
| HB 400<br>7/1/16        | “Bob’s Bill” – classifying pain, anxiety, or depression, if related to terminal illness as a qualifying condition in the Delaware Medical Marijuana Act  | Yes     |
| SB 24<br>6/30/17        | Removing the requirement that a psychiatrist be the physician who signs the written certification in support of an applicant's application for medical cannabis and adding anxiety to the list of debilitating conditions which a person can have to be eligible for medical cannabis. | Yes     |
| HB 210<br>7/2/17        | Allowing minors subject to debilitating medical conditions not specifically listed in § 4906A(b) the same petition process to have their condition considered as that allowed for adults.  | Yes     |
| HB 110<br>6/28/18       | Legalizing cannabis for adults 21 and older and creating a regulated market for cannabis.  | No Vote |
